



PALOMAR PROMISE REQUIREMENTS (class of 2019)

Deadline: March 2, 2019

- Apply for **Admission** (www.palomar.edu)
- Apply for **FAFSA** or **DREAM ACT** (www.fafsa.gov or dream.csac.ca.gov)
Add Palomar College (001260) for your college
- Apply for **First Year Experience (FYE) Program** (lower right of the Student Center screen)

To qualify for Palomar Promise+ (year 2 funding)

Deadline: March 2, 2019

- Complete TSMP Scholar Application (<http://thesanmarcospromise.org>)
- Complete EVERFI financial literacy online course with minimum 70% score on each module

Additional Requirements (upon graduation)

- Graduate high school with a 2.5 GPA

OTHER STEPS TO COMPLETE (before you will be able to enroll in fall classes at Palomar College)

- Submit your final high school transcript to Palomar College by July 1, 2019
- Complete Orientation at Palomar College or online
- Complete an Educational Plan with a Palomar College counselor

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Funding: Promise Plus funds are last dollar up to \$600/semester (\$1200 max per year)

To maintain eligibility students must:

1. Maintain full-time status (12 units or more per semester), a 2.0 overall GPA and be continuously enrolled as a Palomar student to receive funding each semester.
2. Complete the FAFSA or CA DREAM Act by the deadline each year
3. Complete a minimum of 20 volunteer hours per academic year at TSMP, SMUSD, and/or community events as communicated through TSMP staff.

Transfer to CSUSM

Upon successful completion of all CSU transfer requirements within three years from the time of high school graduation, students transferring to CSUSM may apply to receive the PACE Promise Scholarship, a total value of \$2,000 over two years.
